Form 990, Part III, Line 2 - Blue Marble Space (BMS) operates as an umbrella brand that launches scientific and educational initiatives to further its cause. The Blue Marble Space Institute of Science (BMSIS) is the research arm of BMS and conducts basic and applied research in Earth system science and space exploration (http://www.bmsis.org). The Global Catastrophic Risk Institute (GCRI) also extends the research of BMSIS by studying threats to civilization and the future of humanity (http://gcrinstitute.org/). S.A.G.A.N. (Social Action for a Grassroots Astrobiology Network) is a web-based social network to sustain a community of scientists and science enthusiasts, and foster mentoring between scientists and science enthusiasts (http://saganet.org/). One Flag in Space (OFiS) seeks to use the "Blue Marble" image of Earth to promote international unity through space exploration (http://www.oneflaginspace.org/).

Form 990, Part VI, Section B, Line 11b - Form 990 was completed by two members of the BMS board of directors, Sanjoy Som (SS) and Jacob Haqq-Misra (JH). JH created an account on the Form 990 Online website (https://efile.form990.org/) and entered preliminary information. SS then entered the required budget information and checked to make sure form 990 accurately reflects the BMS accounting records kept using Intuit Quickbooks. JH and SS then met via Skype to discuss completion of Schedule O, which includes descriptions of the major program activities of BMS. JH and SS completed these sections using a shared Google document, which JH then entered into the online form 990. JH and SS both made one final check through the form for accuracy, and then JH signed and submitted the form.

Form 990, Part VI, Section C, Line 19 - Documents relating to BMS are all made publically available on the BMS website (http://www.bluemarblespace.org/about). These include articles of incorporation for the state of Washington, a letter of exemption from the IRS, documentation of organizational structure, and documentation of bylaws (which includes a conflict of interest policy). Form 990, Part XI, Line 5 - Part XI line 1 shows \$66426, as net revenue. Of this amount, \$6148 are liabilities from the Global Catastrophic Risk Institute (GCRI - see Schedule O, Part III, section 4a - and included in the \$8097 total liabilities listed in Part X line 26), and thus do not count as a net asset of line 6, so \$6148 is subtracted. Although GCRI is not a separate program service for FY11, we include a description here as it will become such a program in FY12.
